World War II 1945 Timeline

February 13-14: 900 British and American bombers hit Dresden, Germany

- A large population center
- A cultural center
- Using incendiary bombs
- Intending to cause catastrophic firestorms
- 35,000 + people died

March 19-29: Firebombing of Tokyo and other Japanese cities

- Using Napalm
- 100,000 deaths

April 12: Roosevelt dies. Truman takes over/

May 7: Germany surrenders to allies

May 9: Germany surrenders to the Soviets

June 22: Okinawa conquered – last island on the way to the Japanese homeland. To be used as a jumping off point for the eventual invasion of the Japanese islands.

July 16: Atomic bomb successfully tested

July 17- Aug. 2: Potsdam meeting (Truman, Churchill, Stalin) and the resulting final ultimatum to the Japanese

- "Unconditional" surrender with only a slight, and hardly definitive, hint at the possibility of retaining the emperor
- Or face "utter destruction"

July 31: Japanese reject the Potsdam ultimatum

Aug. 6: Hiroshima attack

Aug. 8: Soviet Union declares war on Japan

Aug. 9: Nagasaki attack (Only 3 days after Hiroshima)

Aug. 10: Japan requests "conditional" surrender. Denied.

Aug. 14: Japan accepts "unconditional" terms.

Aug. 30: Occupation of Japan starts with the emperor left greatly weakened, but in place, despite the "unconditional" terms of the surrender.

Sept. 2: Japanese formally surrender to the allies on board the U.S.S. Missouri
